

Newman History

As early as 1935, the late Dr. O.C. Newman "a well trained specialist in many areas of general practice," recognized that, neither he, his physician sons, nor his nephew could give the maximum in skilled services to the people of their service area in the various specialities of medicine and surgery.

With that in mind and Mrs. Della Smith Newman, an Oklahoma pioneer known in the vicinity of Shattuck as the "mother of doctors," by their side, each member of the then existing Newman Clinic directed special attention and interest toward a specialty of medical and surgical practice and set about obtaining new physicians to help provide more complete specialty coverage.

Dr. O.C. Newman continued a highly skilled general medical and surgical practice. Dr. M.H. Newman directed his attention and interest to General Surgery and Urology. Dr. F.S. Newman to Eye, Ear, Nose and Throat, and Dr. J.J. Smith to Obstetrics and Gynecology.

In 1951, Dr. Walter H. Dersch Jr. joined the clinic after completing three years of specialty training in Internal Medicine and Heart Disease at the University Hospital.

In 1952, Dr. Richard H. Burgtorf completed his specialty training in Bone and Joint Surgery and joined the clinic specializing in Bone and Joint Surgery and the treatment of Rheumatic Diseases.

In 1960, Elwood Riley became the Administrator of the flourishing Newman Memorial Hospital. Mr. Riley later became the recipient of the Oklahoma Hospital Association's Distinguished Service Award for his involvement and support aiding in the development of a progressive concept of sharing and cooperative joint ventures among Oklahoma hospitals.

Coincident with the completion of the new Annex to the hospital came Dr. Howard B. Keith specializing in Thoracic and Vascular Surgery, Dr. Jack T. Dancer specializing in General Surgery, and Dr. L.A. Myers practicing Family Medicine and Anesthesia.

The Newman team continued to develop with the additions of Gwenn Stafford - Director of Nurses, Robert E. Rodriguez - Physical Therapist, L.R. Sidders - Clinic Manager, Gary J. Beeby - Speech and Hearing Therapist, Evans Brown - Inhalation Therapy, Pem T. Grace - Chief Medical Technologist, William C. Hopson - Chief X-Ray Technologist, and Esther Bowles - Operating Room Supervisor.

As Newman continues to flourish, it is important to remember our predecessors and their leadership. In the next issues of the "Frog". we will be highlighting these Newman Pioneers and their contributions to the success of Newman Memorial and its growth.
