During this time, I spent meaningful moments reflecting on the work we have accomplished together as a community; expanding access points to care, strengthening local services, and delivering measurable, positive impact for the people we serve. As we begin charting our strategic plan for the year ahead, our focus remains clear: continued growth, a strengthened clinical presence, and ensuring that the economic impact of healthcare remains local, where it belongs. When communities invest in their hospitals, those investments fuel jobs, stability, and generational opportunity. Recently, CMS and the Trump Administration made their intentions for rural healthcare unmistakably clear through the deployment of the Rural Health Transformation Plan. This approach ensures that care remains rooted in hometowns, while simultaneously stimulating local economies, expanding hospital capabilities, creating jobs, and reinforcing long-term community resilience. Newman has already begun executing on this vision through strategic partnerships with leading Academic Medical Centers and nationally respected institutions known for advancing evidence-based care. These collaborations represent thoughtful, logical, and professionally aligned synergies, and I am genuinely excited to see them come to life in 2026. Today, Newman is no longer viewed simply as a small rural hospital. We are increasingly recognized by legislators and healthcare leaders as a model steward of rural healthcare systems; demonstrating what is possible when independence, innovation, and community commitment intersect. While we should pause to recognize and celebrate the extraordinary efforts of our communities, we are clear-eyed about the work ahead. 2026 presents both complexity and opportunity and we are ready. Understanding Your Medicare Options, and Help with Enrollment at Newman Memorial Hospital


As Medicare open enrollment approaches, it's important to review your healthcare coverage options for 2026. Beneficiaries can choose between Original Medicare, which offers broad provider access and optional supplemental coverage, or a Medicare Advantage plan, which may include lower premiums and added benefits but often has network restrictions and prior authorization requirements. Medicare open enrollment runs October 15 through December 7, with coverage starting January 1. To help local residents navigate their choices, Newman Memorial Hospital will host Anahi Espinoza every second Thursday of the month beginning January 8, 2026, to answer questions and assist with enrollment.
